

Freshman Admission Summary 2021

Division of Enrollment Management

Dear colleagues,

Although the world is tired of hearing about “unprecedented times”, it’s impossible to ignore just how unprecedented the journey to DePaul was for the fall 2021 freshman class. This fall, DePaul welcomed yet another record-breaking freshman cohort, enrolling 2,838 students. These students engaged with admissions staff and faculty over zoom, watched “live” virtual tours given by current students, and in many cases didn’t get to set foot on campus until after they had made a decision to attend. The persistence and the optimism of this cohort have been inspirational to all who supported them in the past year.

The number of freshman applications received for Fall 2021 set a new university record, which allowed for greater selectivity in the admissions process and resulted in a class with higher academic preparation. Average GPA of enrolled students increased, as did average SAT composite among test-submitters, even as test-optional students made up 55% of the cohort.

In line with DePaul’s mission to make a college education accessible to all qualified students, this freshman class represents students from a diverse set of backgrounds. This fall, 47% of freshman are students of color, 32% are first-generation, 32% are Pell-eligible and 23% are from the City of Chicago.

The students who started at DePaul as freshman in fall 2021 were high school juniors in the spring of 2020 – as they started narrowing down their list of colleges, the COVID-19 pandemic pushed them to online learning just as it blocked their ability to visit college campuses. This summary is a testament of the combined efforts of staff and faculty to create new ways to interact with students in a world that suddenly went virtual. Welcoming these students in-person to campus in fall 2021 was the culmination of innovation, collaboration and flexibility, and we are so thankful for University colleagues who supported the students on their journey to DePaul.



Freshman Admission Trends


Both freshman enrollment and the freshman applicant totals were the largest in university history, breaking the record set in 2020.

Freshman Applicants, Enrollment and Admission Rates






Admission Rates

To comply with federal standards on reporting of race and ethnicity, students must identify their ethnicity and their race. For ethnicity, students must select either Hispanic or non-Hispanic. 



University Honors Program

DePaul enrolled 453 freshmen in the University Honors Program this fall. The program brings students together in an interdisciplinary curriculum that integrates a well-designed liberal arts education with the cultural resources of the global city of Chicago. Working in small seminars under the direction of dedicated faculty, honors students join a scholarly community engaging in transformative experiences.



Select Admission Initiatives

Test-Optional Admission

This fall, 55% of the freshman class, or 1,552 students, enrolled through the test-optional program. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, standardized test were widely unavailable for students, resulting in many institutions adopting a test-optional or test-blind policy this admission cycle. DePaul has been test-optional since 2012.

Our research shows that the single best predictor of college success—by an overwhelming margin—is high school performance in a rigorous, college-preparatory curriculum.

The enrolling freshmen who did not submit test scores have a comparable high school GPA with freshmen who applied with test scores—3.80 compared with 3.84.


New Test-Optional Freshmen by Ethnicity

DePaul enrolled 160 new freshmen in the program, or about 6% of the entering class.

In addition, 31% come from outside Illinois, 18% are male and 10% from Chicago Public Schools.
